Group Discussion Questions:

1. What do you value most about this Corridor and the adjacent neighborhoods?
2. Given the housing needs of the community, where are the best opportunities for adding housing along the Corridor?
3. What types of businesses could be supported through improved access by walking, biking and transit in and around the Corridor?
 - a. Where might these businesses be located?
4. What improvements could be made to better connect the surrounding neighborhoods to the Corridor and the Downtown?
 - a. Specifically, what improvements could be made for pedestrians, cyclists and/or transit users?

Suggested Ground Rules:

1. Listen as an ally with respect and without interruptions or personal attacks.
2. One person speaks at a time. Avoid dominating the discussion so that everyone has an opportunity to contribute. Try to defer to an existing conversation thread.
3. Express your own views and do not attempt to speak for others.
4. Share information to help inform MAPC recommendations and City of Melrose decisions. Ask questions of others to understand what they are saying and why.
5. It is perfectly OK to disagree, but remember, this is a discussion...not a debate. It is more important to help MAPC understand different perspectives than persuade someone else to agree with you.
6. Raise your hand to signal the facilitator(s) you wish to be recognized. Facilitators will do their best to take note of order in which members asked to be recognized.
