Once in place, those resources enhance personal independence; allow residents to age in place; and foster residents' engagement in the community's civic, economic, and social life.




## **Age-Friendly Communities**

An age-friendly community is one that is free from physical and social barriers and is supported by policies, systems, services, products and technologies that:

- promote health and build and maintain physical and mental capacity across the life course; and
- enable people, even when experiencing capacity loss, to continue to do the things they value.






#### Developing an age-friendly community: the process





- AARP worked with the American Planning Association to develop model legislation — specifically, a state statute and a local ordinance — as a resource to assist planners and government officials in evaluating potential changes in state laws and local zoning codes.
- This publication is an update of that model legislation, which was released in the year 2000. This section provides an overview of what ADUs are and why they are so needed.

#### Model Local ADU Ordinance

This model ordinance is designed for communities in places where state law allows for local ordinances authorizing and governing ADUs but does not impose any constraints on local governments.




