








Mission

Our mission is to promote smart growth and regional collaboration. Our regional plan, **MetroCommon**2050, guides our work as we engage the public in responsible stewardship of our region's future.

Governance

MAPC is governed by

- 101 municipal government representatives
- 21 gubernatorial appointees
- · 9 state officials
- 3 City of Boston officials

An Executive Committee composed of 25 members oversees agency operations and appoints an Executive Director. The agency employs approximately 100 professional and administravie staff.
