




MAPE CREATIVE PLACEMAKING

Honor traditions shaped by the lived experience of a community's residents, such as music, dance, design, crafts, fashion, cuisine, and oral expression.




Natick Creative Placemaking Strategy, 2018






MAPE PUBLIC ARTMAKING

- Independent federal agency established by Congress in 1965
- Largest funder of art and arts education in communities nationwide and catalyst for public and private support of the arts
- Partnership Agreements with state art agencies & regional arts agencies




Project-Based NEA Grant Opportunities

- Grants for Arts Projects (\$10K \$100K)
 - Deadlines: February and July
- Challenge America (\$10K)
 - Deadline: April
 - First-time or non-funded past applicants
- Our Town (\$25K \$150K)
 - Deadline: August 3rd



OUR TOWN GOALS





Creative placemaking integrates arts, culture, and design activities into efforts that strengthen communities.

Creative placemaking requires partnership across sectors, deeply engages the community, involves artists, designers and culture bearers, and helps to advance local economic, physical, and/or social change, ultimately laying the groundwork for systems change.

- Creative business development and professional artist development.



- Partnership with the Networking Organization for Vietnamese Americans







RECENT OUR TOWN PROJECTS

Partnership

- Nonprofit 501(c)3
- Local Government or Quasi Government Entity

Grant Match

- NEA Our Town Grants range from \$25,000 to \$150,000
- Requires a 1:1 Share/Match
