

EDA & THE PROJECT



EDA (Economic Development Administration) Funded. EDA funded OCPC with a cash match, to develop two tools that will provide municipalities and other partners in the region with up-to-date, usable economic development and recovery related data and analysis:



A Data Dashboard will provide municipalities and other partners in the region with data they need to develop successful funding applications and understand the outlook for their local/regional economy.



A Municipal Assessment Tool will help municipalities understand how business-friendly and investment-ready they are and help them identify areas for improvement and diversification and build on regional assets that spur economic growth and resiliency.

HOW IT WORKS



Master Matrix and Categories - Our interpretation of economic development baseline are fundamentals for the OCPC region.



Color-coding system - A 30,000-foot perspective [or snapshot] of each municipality based on the presence of economic development tools generally known to provide positive impact.



Recommendations offered for each community to consider implementing.

Key:



STRONG

The community has made full and proper use of this existing feat or amenity - achieving maximum value it offers to residents and businesses. Resources are efficiently allocated, and services are we maintained and accessible to all residents.



FΔIR

The community has some elements or version of the feature, tool amenity, but there may be gaps or limitations in their availability utilization. Efforts are made to improve and expand services, but not be fully realized yet.



NEEDS IMPROVEMENT/ NOT ACCESSIBLE

The community lacks significant use or presence of this feature, to amenity. Resources are scarce, and services may be inadequate or existent. There is a need for substantial improvement and investment the needs of residents.
